

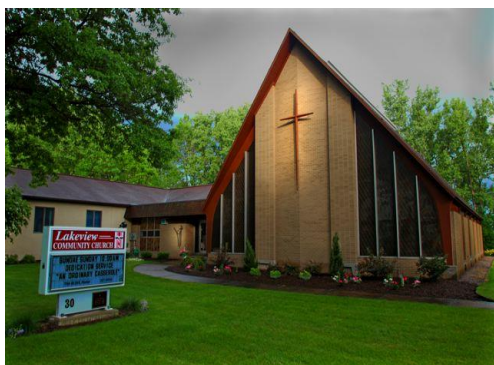

**Invited to Thrive!**

*by Pastor Rick*

You are invited to thrive! This is your invitation to be part of something very special at Lakeview Community Church in early September. It is a Saturday seminar dedicated to helping churches go beyond surviving to thriving. It's called "Thriving Essentials." It's right around the corner and there's no doubt that this is an incredible opportunity for all. Below are the details you need to know:

What: Thriving Essentials workshop

Where: Lakeview Community Church fellowship hall

When: Saturday, September 7 (8:30am to 3pm)

Bonus: Lunch and snacks will be provided

Cost: Free!

The workshop will be led by *Rev. Elaine May*, Congregational Renewal Leader with Thrive (Christian Reformed Church of North America) [www.crcna.org/Thrive](http://www.crcna.org/Thrive). Elaine will be driving all the way from Grand Rapids, Michigan; and stopping in Canada to pick up a friend who will be joining her. She's quite excited to lead Lakeview to consider its vision for the future. She also encouraged us to invite other churches to participate. So, we got the word out to 10 Reformed Churches (RCA) and 3 Christian Reformed Churches (CRC) in Western New York.

The course is designed to equip and inspire. Thriving Essentials is a new way to get our church aligned on core concepts of mission, discipleship, discernment, and leadership. A few words about each of these four essentials. **Mission:** "every church is called to participate in God's mission, but each church needs to discern their niche within that larger mission." **Discipleship:** "we'll look at how churches thrive when they help members put their discipleship into practice throughout the week." **Discernment:** "waiting upon the Lord has almost become counter-cultural, but we'll look at how churches thrive when they resist the temptation to do and instead foster the impulse to discern." **Leadership:** "Jesus flipped around our preconceptions about power and leadership." It all sounds quite interesting, don't you think?

Overall, this course provides refreshing insights, serving as a springboard to deeper conversations about ministry in our local context. (Find out more: [www.crcna.org/essentials](http://www.crcna.org/essentials)) There is no cost to you since it is subsidized by the Classis of Rochester (RCA). 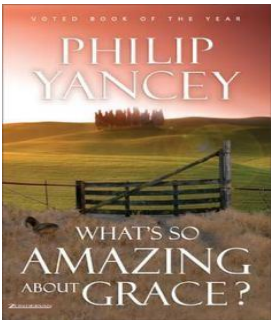

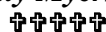

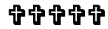

Thanks to everyone who donated peanut butter, baked beans, and cat food during the month of July. Our emergency request for cat food is one we have never experienced before. The GEFS appreciated our positive response, and knows they can count on us to help whenever we can.

With the turn of the calendar page, thoughts here at Lakeview turn to our annual “**August Challenge.**” Can you believe this will be our 16th year holding this event?! Our first August Challenge was held in 2009 after seeing all the empty shelves at the Maiden Lane site. Summer is always a tough time at the Food Shelf, and this year is no exception. Kids that receive subsidized breakfasts and lunches at school are now home for the summer. Many clubs and organizations that regularly contribute don't meet during the summer, and attendance at churches drops during the summer due to vacations and other activities, so our support is critical at this time of year.

If you have been following the posted clues, you may have already guessed that our requested focus item this year is instant mashed potatoes. They come in both boxes and pouches and are a lot lighter than the cans of chunky soup we collected last year! *Our optimistic goal this year is 1200 boxes/pouches of potatoes.* Obviously, our small church can't do this alone, so please enlist everyone you can to help. Our lakeshore neighbors have become one of our most helpful assets, especially during our "drive in & drop off" which will be held on August 31st this year from 9 AM to 1 PM.

Please enlist your extended family, friends, neighbors, and co-workers to help. If shopping is difficult, there will be boxes at both entrances for

cash contributions so we can shop for you. If you will not be entering the actual church building during August, you can send checks to Lakeview with GEFS entered on the memo line. We also accept cash at our Saturday “drive up” for one last shopping trip before the food is delivered.

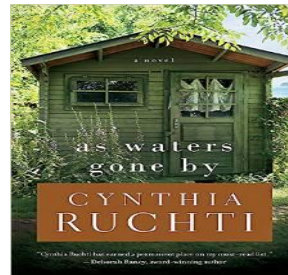

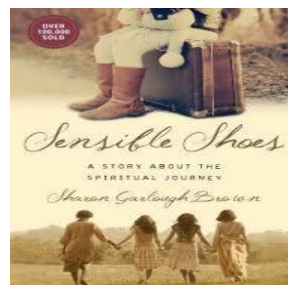
## LIBRARY

*Sweet Memories* ... As we begin to think about the end of summer and welcome the cooler days of fall, thought you might enjoy these “*Memories of Lakeview*” from a couple of former “*Lakeviewers*”—a time to reminisce and think of younger days at Lakeview as we prepare for this year’s **RALLY DAY!** “Memories” ...from the history books of *Sheila Williams*, Lakeview Historian

*...from Mary DeForest (Wife of 2<sup>nd</sup> Pastor of Lakeview)*

I have wonderful memories of our 13 years spent serving Lakeview Community Church. We moved to Rochester, NY, to begin our ministry at Lakeview in June of 1962, just two weeks after our wedding. Our first home was a small cottage on the shores of Long Pond which led out to Lake Ontario, about a mile from the church. Since the church did not have a study, Rob worked from home for our first few years.

I was thrilled to be right on the water complete with a dock for fishing. That first summer, I learned to fish from that dock. The first few times I called Rob to come out and bait my hook and take the fish off when I caught one. After only one day, I was informed that “if you fish, you also need to bait your hook and take off anything you catch!” There was no more disturbing the new minister!

Lakeview was a new young church with Rob being only their second pastor. People were very loving and accepting of this new young couple. One woman even took me grocery shopping and advised me never to pay more than 39 cents for a pound of ground beef! She also taught me how to preserve tomatoes, peaches, pears, and applesauce, a skill that I still use yearly after almost 60 years.

Being only a few years older than our youth group, we had a wonderful bond with them. It was a very vibrant group who always sat in the very front row pews on Sunday morning, a very inspiring sight for the congregation to see. We still keep in touch with many after almost 60 years.

We undertook two major building projects while there. As the congregation grew, it was decided to add a new, larger sanctuary to our existing building, thus also providing more space in the older part for more Sunday school classes which were very much needed. It was a joyous day when we moved in, complete with a lovely cross built by one of our members for the front of the sanctuary, and a study in the church for Rob to work. Many of our members provided many hours of labor during the construction.

As our children grew, the congregation decided that our small cottage, which did not have heat in the second-floor bedrooms, was no longer adequate for our family. A lovely new parsonage was built next to the church.

As the years passed, we developed new yearly traditions. Palm Sunday was a service that I especially remember. Rob always preached his sermon “in the first person” that day, taking on the role of one of the people from the Bible who were personally experiencing the events of Holy Week. It truly did bring the meaning of those events into a whole new light for the congregation.

Our Thanksgiving services were also very special for me. We would gather in the sanctuary, sing lovely Thanksgiving hymns, and instead of a traditional sermon, hear from three people from the congregation...one teenager, one of middle age, and one of our older members. Each shared thankful times and events in which they had been blessed that year. It was an amazing and inspiring service.

Another of my favorite memories was the Christmas Eve services. The church was always full with all dressed in their holiday best. The sanctuary was beautifully lit and decorated, the choir blessed us with wonderful music, and favorite carols were sung. The service always ended with the singing of "Silent Night" while the light of Christ gradually filled the sanctuary as candles were lit. The love and peace of God surrounded us all!

*...from Rev. Robert DeForest (2<sup>nd</sup> Pastor of Lakeview)*

Lakeview Community Church was where I became a minister. All of the things I had learned in seminary finally took on meaning. I was 24 years old and not too much older than the members of the Youth Group. I bonded quickly with them and we had many wonderful experiences. They were a fun-loving group that often met in our house. I had my hands full keeping them from shooting their water guns at our cuckoo clock when it sang.

Lakeview was a new church, having had only one regular pastor before me. Everything seemed so fresh and alive and we tried to do all the things the other churches did. We had Sunday school classes for all ages staffed by old and young teachers. And we even had a Bible School every summer.

Some of the older members of the church were campers, and they often asked Mary and me to join them. I thought this was kind of them and we always had a good time.

While at Lakeview, two major building projects were undertaken. First was the building of a new parsonage. The house we were living in had no heat in the upstairs area; it relied on open registers on the living room ceiling to allow heat to rise and heat the bedrooms. However, this cottage was located on a nice pond so it was not without its perks. Thankfully, our building committee thought we should have a new house nearer to the church, and that came to pass.

Second, it was determined we needed a new sanctuary for worship. A beautiful A-frame church was built next to the existing building. So many memories exist concerning this major accomplishment. In order to meet a deadline, the men of the church were asked to come back one Sunday afternoon to nail boards on that steep roof. Amazing!

Toward the end of our thirteenth year, one of the ladies confided to me that when she heard that a young minister was coming, she thought they would make mincemeat out of him. She was glad that had not happened, and so was I.
