

THRIVE IN 2025!

Thrive in 2025? You may react to that title, asking yourself: "Hasn't Pastor Rick beat that drum before?" The answer is Yes, of course. In September we hosted a seminar called "Thriving Essentials." After the seminar concluded, I embarked on a four-part preaching series that reinforced the message even further. God calls us to go beyond surviving to thriving. Some may wonder what's wrong with survival.

Well survival is primarily fear based, but thriving takes some faith. Fear is a natural human response. Here are the top three human fears: Fear of failure, fear of loss, and fear of change. No wonder there is some pushback and resistance in the church when you try to move forward and do things a bit differently. God speaks into our fears when we read his Holy Word. The Spirit inspired Isaiah to write: "Do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand." (Isaiah 41:10)

It's so comforting to realize that God will help us and strengthen us so that we can face our fears. The Spirit inspired John to write down the words of Jesus: "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid." (John 14:27) It's so comforting to realize that Jesus gives us his peace to calm our troubled hearts and counteract our fears.

What are we afraid of at Lakeview Community Church? I can't read your minds but I wonder if some of us are afraid of the future. The future is unknown to us (but God knows). We ask one another if our little church on Long Pond Road will continue to survive into the next decade and beyond. The danger is this: If we focus too much on survival, we'll just maintain the status quo. In contrast, a faith-forward mentality will make bold moves as God leads.

I also wonder if some of our concern has to do with finances. At the annual congregational meeting, the intensity of the conversation and the number of comments increased significantly when financial matters were discussed. I've been

a church member all my life and this is not uncommon. People seem to get really fired up about finances. So, what is the main concern? What are we so afraid of? That we'll run out of money? That we won't be able to pay our bills? There is a remedy to a fear-based mentality of survival. It's faith. Faith looks back to remember God's actions in the past. Faith is able to remember the Exodus, recalling that God sustained His people in their wilderness wanderings by giving them manna to eat. Faith can look back decades, recalling that God has provided for Lakeview to do ministry in our community for over 70 years! If he did it before, he can do it again! It's so much easier to have faith when you follow a faithful God. Faith looks up to a loving God who desires for his church to thrive. The Spirit enables us to believe in the true God who preserves, protects, and provides. God preserves His church as it marches forward in the 21st century. God protects His people from threats both inside and outside our four walls. Finally, God provides both financial and human resources so that our church can flourish in the coming year. Rose & I don't want to just survive. Our dream for Lakeview is to see it thrive. By the Holy Spirit, God has the power to accomplish it.

In 2024, the deacons of Lakeview continued in the path of serving the community, although our approach changed due to decreased attendance over time. We chose to dedicate one month for monetary support and the following month for more direct support in volunteer services to that local organization. Our monetary collection averaged between \$500 to 900 every other month to a dedicated local organization.

We served meals at Saving Grace Ministries, Open Door Mission, Cameron Ministries, and The Father's Heart Ministry. Volunteers donated and sorted clothing at Saving Grace Ministries and the Open Door Mission. We toured the facilities at Saving Grace Ministries, The Father's Heart Ministry, and Mission Share. In December we worked with the Salvation Army in organizing an Angel Tree at our church, of which 43 Christmas presents were collected for children in need. On December 14, we rang bells for the Salvation Army Red Kettle Campaign at Tops Friendly Market in Hilton. During July and August, we supported other church groups to meet their goals of providing food to Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf and Mission Share here in Greece.

We plan to continue this same style of mission work in 2025, providing to the same local organizations. We couldn't have done this without the support of our church members, and we thank you for your generous support.

LAKEVIEW'S WEBSITE UPDATE

Lakeview Website celebrates 10 years of spreading the news.

The presence of Lakeview on the Internet continues to grow as more and more people turn to it for information and the "good news" preached from the pulpit. During 2024, the website averaged over 300 people visiting every month, with 100 listening to the sermons that are recorded every Sunday and posted to the website. We've seen an increasing number of people downloading the Sunday sermon in what's called a Podcast, a way folks can download the sermon and listen to it on their "smart phone" or other electronic devices at any time.

Although the average is 20 on any given Sunday, some sermons have drawn as many as 60 downloads. Yes, these are just numbers but it does show that there is a growing thirst for people to hear the Gospel and be drawn closer to the love of our Savior. Looking at the number of people in the pews, we see a number much smaller than the number of folks who weekly, are drawn to the message of Grace and love as the website continues to further the mission of Lakeview to "have our hearts centered on Christ and to be open to our neighbors."
